Dear families,

Welcome to our last newsletter for the term.

We are enjoying the change in weather, although it means we will need to start focusing on watering our gardens more!

Just a gentle reminder regarding hats and drink bottles, as per my Seesaw message. Drink bottles are preferred to drinking from the taps, for obvious reasons, such as not spreading potential colds and flus etc. Also, when children need to leave class for a drink it means loss

ATSI News

This term, we have been working hard on a special project with Matthew Trump from Wildfire Creations to create a new Acknowledgement of Country video for our school. Our students performed beautifully and we are excited to launch the video at a whole school assembly in Term 4.



Our ATSI Action Team chose to run a girls group and boys group this term. All the girls met in the Nunga Room on Thursday, Week 8 to do a beading activity. We started by gathering in a yarning circle and introducing ourselves. The older students were buddied up with a younger student to support them in making a bracelet to represent themselves. The boys will meet in Week 9 to participate in a whole group sporting activity.













National Science Week 2023

The theme for National Science Week 2023 was Innovation: Powering Future Industries. During their specialist Science lessons, Hendon's scientists focused on "Innovations Around Us".

Junior Primary classes discovered that computers use an on/off code to store information. The pattern of the code is important! We used this 'binary code' (from Latin, meaning consisting of two) to create a bracelet with a pattern representing the first letter of our names.

Middle and Upper Primary classes launched our main project about survival and sustainability. We created a draft plan for survival in an undeveloped area. We made decisions about location of shelter, collection and storage of water, and types of food.

In the weeks since, we have conducted a series of investigations and looked for information from a range of sources to determine if our original plans are suitable and sustainable. At the end of our project we will make recommendations for changes to our plans, as scientists do when faced with evidence of better choices.
