# Principal's Message

Dear Families,

Welcome to the new school year. 2024 is shaping up to be an amazing year and we are excited about the positive start we have had.

Staff started the year on a positive note with the third day of our Berry Street wellbeing training in Week 0. The focus of this day was around stamina and engagement for learning. We have prioritised a relationship focus across the school for the first 2 weeks, as a foundation to positive classroom environments. No doubt you will have heard about some of the special activities the classes have been participating in to develop these strong connections, via your child, Seesaw or the class newsletter. Classes have adopted a buddy class this year and these additional relationships are already helping to support children in developing a sense of belonging and for older children, an opportunity to demonstrate leadership and mentor our younger children.

We have welcomed 38 new students to the school this year so far. We would like to extend this welcome to the families of our new enrolments.

Many of our new ancillary staff are supporting teachers and our priority around improved reading outcomes for all children. This year we have been able to fully staff 2 x 50min lessons a day as part of our commitment to an uninterrupted Literacy block. We are also fully implementing our InitiaLit strategy from this week in Reception to Year 2, so listen out for what your children are saying about their class focus on literacy over the coming weeks.

I would like to thank all families for their patience as we implemented a few changes this term to the structure of our day. I sincerely apologise that in our enthusiasm to start the year with things in place from the beginning that we let ourselves down in the communication department. As a staff our decisions were shared and had been discussed at length, but we acknowledge that we missed the important step around providing ample prior notification to our community.

We are excited about the special events coming up this term including the Seaton High School program many of our senior students are engaged in, acquaintance afternoon, swimming week and sports day on the last day of school. Sports day this year will end with a bang as we celebrate the day with a Colour Spectacular fundraiser – a bit like the Colour Explosion last year, but with SLIME!!

Staff have been discussing ways to increase
Student Voice across the school and we are
working on improved Action Team and decisionmaking structures to reflect how democracy works
and so that students can see that their thinking
is heard and actioned. We are also working on
improving the importance of regular class meetings
and setting of shared goals, especially around yard
improvement, setting targets around our values and
for our fundraising.

#### Dear Parents,

Welcome back to 2024! Exciting developments are underway as we dive into our School Improvement Plan (SIP), a comprehensive roadmap guiding our journey towards enhanced teaching and learning experiences. With a keen focus on student achievement data, we're shaping a learning environment where students fluently decode and comprehend complex texts for curriculum-aligned purposes. Our approach encompasses various facets of practice, from curriculum and pedagogy to assessment, ensuring a holistic approach to education.

Notable highlights from our SIP include the rollout of InitiaLit, a systematic phonics program, and the implementation of a reading quadrant model aimed at targeting specific gaps in reading skills for our students. We're also ramping up our teaching methodologies with 'Explicit Direct Instruction' and forming Improvement Teams dedicated to literacy, numeracy, wellbeing, and inclusion. These initiatives are integral to our commitment to continuous improvement and providing the best educational experience for your child.

Looking ahead, our teachers are gearing up for data collection with 'DIBELS' reading assessments, alongside NAPLAN testing for Year 3 and Year 5 students.

Stay tuned for more updates and information on acquaintance afternoon and parent-teacher interviews in the coming weeks.

We're thrilled to embark on this journey with you and look forward to a term filled with growth, learning, and plenty of excitement!

together and will watch them grow and flower.














To help us learn about each other, we created a joint jigsaw puzzle.
